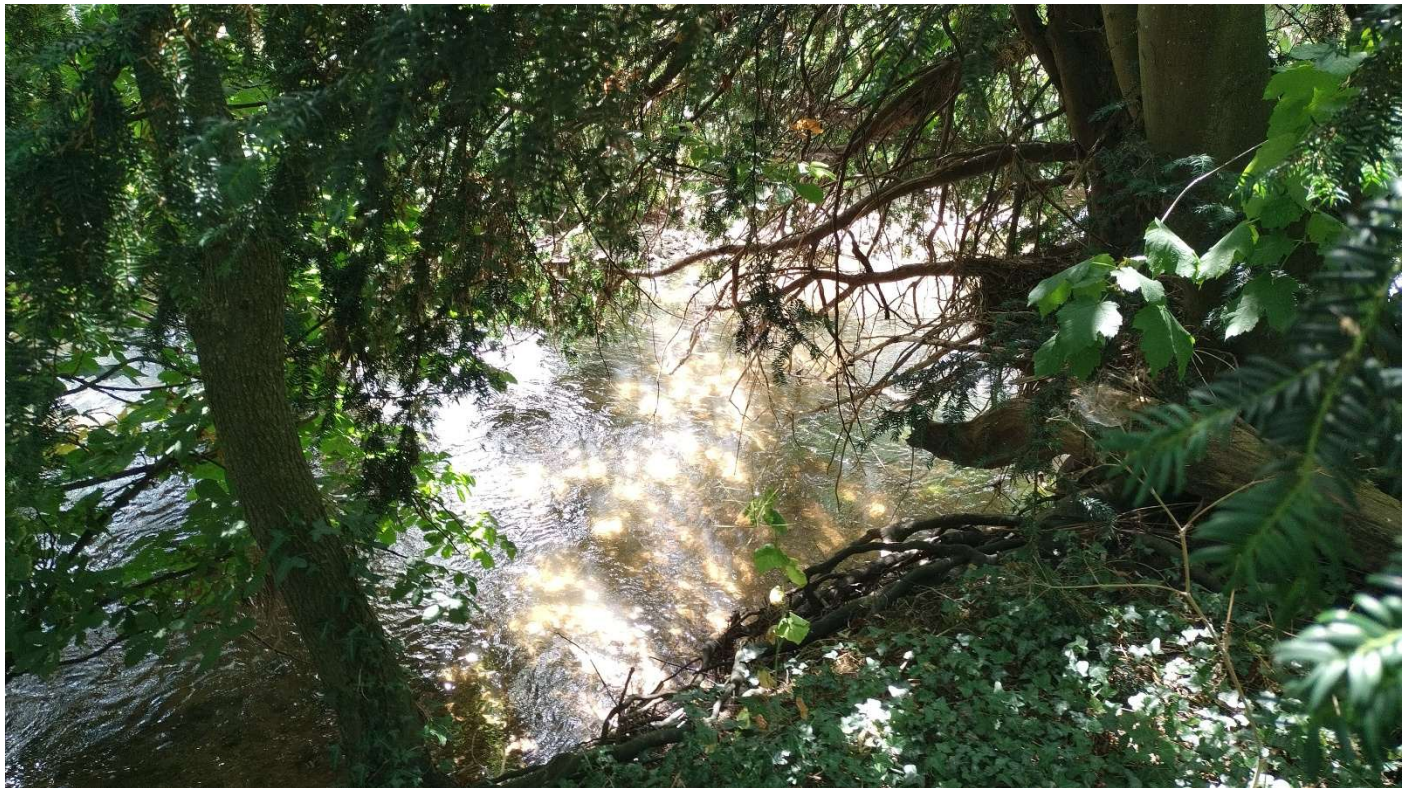

Parish Council News

Halford Parish Council:

Key points from PC meeting on 8th July
James Gopsill was welcomed onto the council as a coopted member.

There continue to be problems with the water system - the burst mains on 6 July is still resulting in lowered pressure for many in the village. Amanda is coordinating reports of all water/sewage issues and we hope to be able to arrange a meeting with ST to discuss these at some future date. Please let Amanda know of future issues so we have as much evidence as possible.

The housing development on Idlicote Rd is likely to start groundwork in September with building starting in February 2027. Initially 3 plots will be developed - one of which will be a show home - although this could change if and when more plots are sold.

Crisis and Resilience Fund:

Eligible Warwickshire residents who rely on heating oil or LPG to heat their homes can now access additional support, delivered through a partnership between Warwickshire County Council and energy charity Act on Energy.

Stour Health and Wellbeing Partnership
(SHWP)

Stronger Communities, Healthier Lives

Now that the weather has changed for the warmer, SHWP's Warm Hub at the Ellen Badger Hospital in Shipston-on-Stour has rebranded! The space is cool and refreshing in the summer months, so we are now known as the **Community Hub** – and a Cool Space. You'll still be assured of a warm welcome, free refreshments and various activities and support if you need it. Sessions continue Mondays and Thursdays from 10am to 12 noon. It is open to all with free parking - we hope you will join us!

With summer temperatures expected to remain high, SHWP is bringing together a network of **Cool Spaces** across Shipston-on-Stour and the surrounding areas. These are welcoming places where people can take a break from the heat, access drinking water, use facilities, connect to Wi-Fi, and enjoy a comfortable environment.

We're inviting local organisations, community groups and venues to join this summer initiative and help support residents during periods of hot weather.

The **Stour Toy Library** continues to grow. The sessions at the Ellen Badger are on a Tuesday 9.30-11am (where you are welcome to Stay & Play!) and Thursday 11am-12noon. There is an annual £5 membership fee, but from then on – all toys are free to borrow. We have over 150 different toys for children aged 0-4.

The **Shipston Repair Café**, again at the Ellen Badger, takes place on the second Saturday of every month from 10am – to 2pm. We have repaired – or attempted to repair – over 20 items a month, saving these household items from landfill and encouraging a growing community network of like-minded people. Everyone who assists is a volunteer who gives up their time to make this happen. Join us next on **Saturday 12th September**.

We're working with Shipston High School and the town to create an **Accessible Shipston Map** to help residents and visitors find places that are easy to access and welcoming for everyone, including people with mobility challenges, visual impairments, and families with buggies. Students are visiting businesses with a short questionnaire to gather information about existing accessibility features and identify opportunities for improvement.

CHURCH NEWS

Remember that the Churchyard and path are used by many villagers, but all this needs constant work to keep it safe and in good condition. *Please note* that although the path down to and along the riverbank is now open, anyone who uses it does so at their own risk, especially when there has been bad weather or flooding.

Foodbank: If you wish to donate items to the Shipston Foodbank, please bring them in a bag to the Church porch between 10.30 and 11.30 every Saturday, hopefully Jane will be there to meet you, otherwise please leave any items in a carrier bag in the porch.

There are already several events planned for 2026, which we will update as the year progresses and give more details nearer each event, but coming up we have:-

The Village Fete: from 2pm to 5 pm on **Saturday 1st August** in the garden at the Bell. Further details are printed elsewhere in Village Voices.

The Church Teas in June raised just over £620. Many thanks to everyone who helped and supported this event.

Church Tower: By the time this issue of Village Voices is printed and distributed there should be obvious evidence of work, such as the erection of scaffolding. The PCC would like to offer their apologies for any inconvenience this may cause, but also make a request for care and vigilance for anyone using the Churchyard as it will effectively be a building site. And as previously mentioned, the PCC would also like to thank all the individuals who helped in the raising of the necessary funds, which involved hard work and generosity, including current members of the Church, former members of the Church and villagers, who were willing to offer time and money in supporting this major project to maintain an iconic building at the heart of the village and a huge part of the community.

Church Clock: Thanks to support from Alderminster Parish Council and from some very generous individual donors we are able to begin the clock repairs. We therefore plan to carry out the work in two phases. The dial will be removed for redecoration and regilding and reinstalled this summer while the tower scaffolding is in place. The work on the clock mechanism can then take place later in the year or early 2027, once the tower

project is complete. It is planned to continue fundraising activities and further details will be given soon – watch this space!

ALDERMINSTER GARDENING CLUB

The club does not meet in August but will have a stall at the village fete on **Saturday August 1st** in the Bell Gardens between 2 and 5pm selling plants, preserves, produce and garden sundries. The club meetings resume on **Tuesday 8th Sept** with a talk from Duncan Coombes on "**The Shaded Garden**". The members' competition is a sprig from a shade loving plant. Visitors are welcome at £3pp (includes refreshments.)

Gill's Green Tips: When you are watering your plants in containers, remember to add some feed once a week in the form of Tomorite or liquid seaweed to keep them flowering; this applies to vegetables and fruit plants in containers as well. Don't worry if your lawn has gone brown, once it rains it will soon recover. I have noticed that there are less insect pests around and I am putting that down to the flowering herbs in my garden such as fennel and lovage which attract predators like lacewings and hoverflies; they've eaten the blackfly on my broad beans! On cooler days make the most of the rest of summer by visiting an open garden, there is a new one in Tysoe, 'Safehaven', 5 Malletts Close CV35 0SY, open from 11-3pm on the following dates, **Saturday August 8th and 22nd, Sunday 9th and 23rd**; don't miss Cedar House, Wasperton, open on **Sunday 30th August** open from 1.30- 5pm, a really beautiful garden open for the NGS. Heroes and Villains Gardens are open on **Saturday 22nd August**, accessed by pre-booked tickets on heartofenglandforest.org/garden, former property of Felix Dennis at Dorsington, it is very impressive.

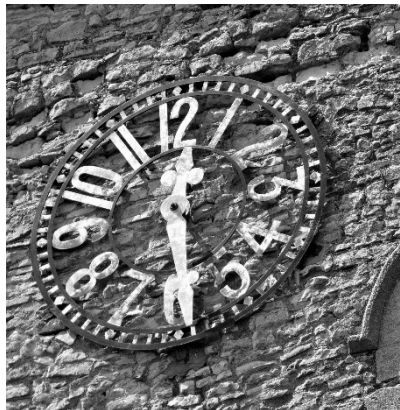
Our next amble is planned for **Wednesday 5th August** when we'll meet at 10am at Alderminster Village Hall.

The Church Clock

The church clock in Alderminster was made by Kay & Co. of Worcester (remember Kay's Catalogue?) and thought to be installed around 1894. William Kay was originally employed as a jeweller's assistant and worked for Skarratt and Co. When he started his own company in 1890, Kay still retained a love for the trade he knew so well. His early catalogues show that he supplied clocks,



watches and timepieces to Worcester and its vicinity. In 1896 Kay bought out Skarratt and Co. and amalgamated the two businesses to include a contract to supply clocks and to The Great Western Railway. Skilled clockmakers were employed from across the country to visit railways and ensure all timepieces were in good working order and maintained the correct time. A Kays clock was built and assembled by them at Paddington Station in 1906. Although it was damaged during WW2, it was repaired and still keeps time above the busy platforms. It has featured in many films from the 1940's and 50's when young men met their girlfriends under the clock.

It is hoped that funds will allow our clock to be repaired soon and once again we will hear the familiar chimes around the village!

Next event: Tuesday 22nd September "Postman's Knock" a talk by Alan Godfrey. A history of the Post Office in England, especially Warwickshire from 1635 until present day. The talk will be in the Alderminster Village Hall 7.30pm Entrance £5 (includes refreshments) Raffle.

Astronomical Society News

The Stratford-upon-Avon Astronomical Society meets every first and third Tuesday at 8pm (doors open at 7.30pm) at Alderminster Village Hall. Everyone is welcome, especially beginners and those wanting to learn more. The first Tuesday is a Club Night; in August Club Night will be on **4th August** and on the third Tuesday **18th August** the speaker will be Martin Jones with a talk called 'Cosmic Coincidence or Stellar Siblings'. Please note that the speakers usually start quite promptly at 8pm.

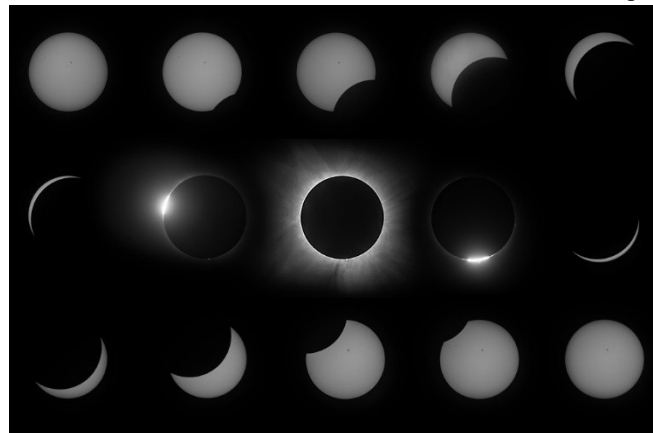
Each month one of our members, Adrian Wakeham, writes an article on aspects of astronomical observation.

The Glorious 12th or why a lot is happening on August 12th and 13th!

This month a couple of cosmic events are happening within a 36-hour period.

The first event is a total eclipse of the Sun on 12th August. Though not fully visible in Warwickshire, totality is visible in Greenland, Iceland, the North Atlantic, Spain and Portugal. In Warwickshire we will be treated to a 90 per cent eclipse. The further west you can get the better. Daylight will noticeably dip, and you might even hear bird singing, they are assuming it is twilight!

To view it you must have proper eye protection, which generally means solar eclipse glasses or a telescope with a solar filter or a dedicated solar telescope.



The eclipse occurs from 18.17 BST with first contact, before reaching maximum coverage (of 90 per cent) at 19.13 BST before last contact at 20.06 BST (which will be very close to the western horizon). It will appear as a crescent shaped Sun. A fun and child friendly way of displaying it is by projecting it on to a white screen, through a small hole. Colanders or a rose from a watering can (removed from it's based) will give you multiple images of the crescent Sun, but again, it must be emphasised, please do not look directly at the Sun without proper protection.

For more information about the UK eclipse, you can go to the website: <https://ukeclipse.com>, which also has a link to reputable suppliers of solar eclipse glasses. Our Society also has a limited number of solar eclipse glasses that we are handing out for free – just pop along to one of our meetings. The other thing which is happening on or around that date, is the Perseid meteor shower. They peak on the 12th and the 13th. They are best observed in the evening or the early hours of the morning of the 13th. They are most comfortably observed, laying on a sun lounger and looking North. You will get better observing after 20 minutes as your eyes have adjusted to the dark. (Make sure you have enough layers on to stay warm). With a bit of luck, you will see meteors (shooting stars) emanating from the Perseus constellation. Some may leave trains (trails) which last for a couple of seconds. They are the result of Earth's orbit crossing the dust and dirt trail of Comet 109P/Swift-Tuttle.

As the Moon will be a very New Moon, this will make viewing a lot easier as the meteors stand out a lot more. So, all we need now is a cloud-free night!

Whilst observing in the early evening, the really bright 'star' in the west will be the planet Venus. If you are staying up all night for the Perseid meteors, the remaining 6 planets will appear, in the East. Firstly Saturn (yellowy-brown in colour), Neptune will be close by (visible through a telescope). They will be below the square of Pegasus. Mars will be up next, in Gemini, appearing pink in colour. Uranus will be below the Pleiades, green and visible through binoculars.

By sunrise, the bright 'star' on the eastern horizon will be Jupiter. Close by will be a less bright 'star', which is Mercury. They are at their closest on the morning of the 15th.

As I always say, don't forget to look down and appreciate the 8th planet, the planet Earth. A fragile and fantastic place.

Club Nights offer more information on what to look out for each month. If it is clear we do some observing just outside the Village Hall, so please join us. There is no charge initially to come along and find out more, but if you do want to become a member then the fee is just £20 a year and it's free if you are in full-time education. 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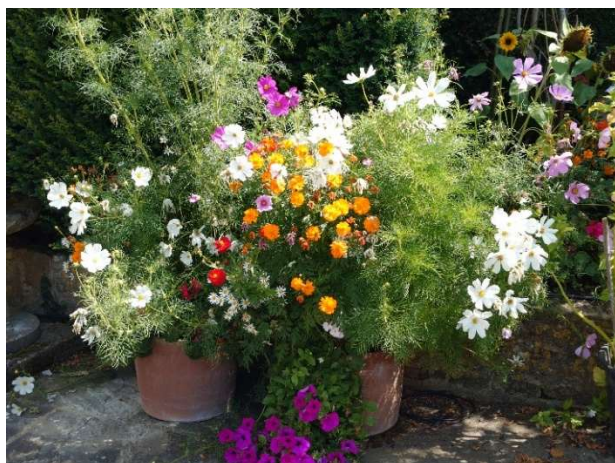
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
