GARY COOPER.

The funeral of Gary Cooper was held at the Oakley Wood Crematorium on Friday 24th April, with the reception being held here, at the Halford Bridge Inn.

Gary was a long-standing and very popular member of our community before he, and his partner Sue, moved away to Bidford in April last year to be near her family. We all know the tragic events that followed: Sue was taken ill and passed away almost immediately after they had moved, leaving Gary alone and completely bereft. His many friends did all they could to help him through the grief, but his health deteriorated steadily throughout last year.

Gary was active in so many areas: in the village he was a member of the Parish Council, and he and Sue were involved in the many activities that went on in and around the church and village hall; they were also heavily involved in quizzes, organising the popular pub quiz in aid of Help For Heroes, and also the annual Village Quiz. With his cheeky grin, Gary always said his quizzes were easy – if you knew the answers - although in reality they were tough, but were also well organised and interesting.

He had a varied life and was very proud of the time he spent in the Far East in the RAF, but his electronic work was secret, so he only ever hinted at what he did there.

Of course, he later had his shop in Shipston and had another career as a DJ – he had a huge collection of records, which he very reluctantly parted with when they moved. He never stopped helping others – I found out only the other day that, 30 years ago, he would go into the various care homes in Stratford with his then wife to provide music and singing sessions. He was keen on golf, and on lawn bowls and even after he stopped playing, he ran the weekly bingo sessions in the bowls club at Bidford. Of course, he also provided the sound equipment for our own annual Feed the Rat celebrations.

Gary was a keen member of Shipston Probus Club and was the Social Secretary there before becoming President in 2023. After he stopped being able to attend the meetings he was made an honorary member in recognition of his work for the club.

Gary will be missed. He was a true friend in every sense, and was always ready to help anyone, even though he suffered from poor health later on.

CHURCH NEWS

A reminder that the Reverend Nicki Chatterton has announced her retirement. The last Sunday Service she will be involved with will be the joint Benefice Service at 10.00am **28th June** 2026 at Ettington.

The full list of Services is printed separately in Village Voices. Everyone is welcome to any of the Services in our beautiful iconic Village Church; coffee and biscuits are usually served afterwards, so why not come along? The Church and Churchyard in Alderminster are enjoyed by many in the village. Although no mow May has become a popular idea today, the idea to leave the Churchyard uncut was the idea of a previous Alderminster Church Warden, David Jones, over 20 years ago before many people were aware or understood such an idea. So, every year the grass and wildflowers are left uncut until June, which allows reseeding and it is a great example of a natural garden and has even been featured on BBC Midlands Today.

Churchyard tidy up: The aim is to cut the grass in June and then there will be the big tidy up of the grass cuttings which should be on **Saturday 13th** June beginning at 10.00am. There should be a sign confirming this outside the Church. Everyone is welcome and refreshments will be provided. Please just come along even if for only some of the time, every little helps. Remember that the Churchyard and path are used by many villagers, but all this needs constant work to keep it safe and in good condition. Please note that although the path down to and along the riverbank is now open, anyone who uses it does so at their own risk, especially when there has been bad weather or flooding.

Foodbank: If you wish to donate items to the Shipston Foodbank, please bring them in a bag to the church porch between 10.30 and 11.30 every Saturday; hopefully Jane will be there to meet you, otherwise please leave any items in a carrier bag in the porch.

Fundraising: There are several events planned for 2026 which we will update as the year progresses and give more details nearer each event. These include: **Church Teas** – Between 2pm and 4pm on every Sunday in June there will be afternoon teas served in Alderminster Churchyard with tea, coffee and delicious cakes available.

Many thanks to everyone who supported both the Cantamus Concert in the Church and the wine tasting in the village hall; a total of £648 was raised at the concert and £999 at the wine tasting. The success of both events was the result of a lot of hard work by a number of people, but special mentions to Carol

Burdekin for organising the Cantamus concert and Zoe Scott for organising the wine tasting. Both would agree that without a team of people behind them then neither event would have been quite so successful.

Church Tower

As previously mentioned, with help from The National Lottery Heritage Fund, a total of nearly £164,000 has been raised which more than meets our funding target for the Tower Restoration Project. The raising of these funds has involved hard work and generosity from a number of people, this includes current members of the Church, former members of the Church and villagers who were just willing to offer time and money. So, the PCC want to offer many thanks to all who have donated so generously so far and expressed an interest in supporting this major project to maintain an iconic building at the heart of the village and a huge part of the community.

As part of this ongoing process, there will be a talk by Ian Ward, the stonemason involved in the restoration work, which is planned for **Saturday 18th** July 2026 starting at 2.30pm, followed by tea in the Church or Churchyard. Please come along if you can; it promises to be a fascinating insight into the world of a stonemason. It is hoped that this talk will be recorded in both audio and video and anyone who would like to help with that should get in touch with the PCC. More details will be given as soon as they are available.

Gill's Green Tips: Hopefully the weather is now warm enough to enjoy the garden, so tender annual vegetable plants can be put out like beans, sweetcorn, cucumbers, squash or courgettes. You may need to cover them at night with fleece or newspaper if frost is forecast. Most garden centres or supermarkets sell veg plants, so you can just buy the number you need. Make use of containers if you are short of space; when planting you can put crushed polystyrene or cardboard in the bottom to aid drainage and cut down on the compost. If you are using peat free compost you will need to add some fertiliser to provide extra nourishment for the plants. If you have gaps in your flower beds or pots, sprinkle on some hardy annual flower seeds like poppies or love in the mist; they come up quickly and will seed themselves to come up for years to come if you like the cottage garden look. To keep insect pests away, try planting French or ordinary marigolds round your vegetables. According to Gardeners' question time, for successful carrot growing, you must sow the seed in a drill that has had boiling water poured on and water every day until you see the carrots come up.

ASTRONOMICAL SOCIETY NEWS

The Stratford-upon-Avon Astronomical Society meets every first and third Tuesday at 8pm (doors open at 7.30pm) at Alderminster Village Hall. Everyone is welcome, especially beginners and those wanting to learn more. The first Tuesday is a Club Night; in June that will be on **2nd June** and the speaker on the third Tuesday, **16th June 2026**, will be Dr Jiachen Jiang from Warwick University with a talk called "*Black Hole Astronomy 101*". Please note that the speakers usually start quite promptly at 8pm.

Each month one of our members, Adrian Wakeham, writes an article on aspects of astronomical observation.

Noctilucent Clouds and Solar Observing.

At this time of year, astronomers start to become grumpy creatures (and their partners start to see a lot more of them) as the days lengthen and nighttime observing becomes difficult. This is because in June full dark skies aren't visible in Britain because of its latitude of 52 degrees north. This is why June contains our longest days and shortest nights. However, other options are available to keep astronomers amused.

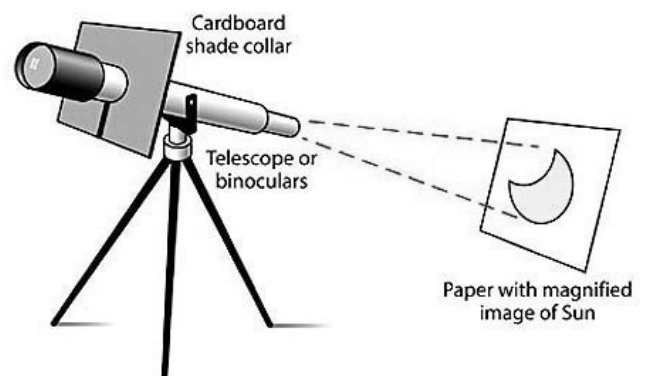
The word 'cloud' normally brings despair into stargazers' hearts, but at this time of year we keep our eyes peeled for noctilucent clouds. These are visible about 45 minutes after sunset or before sunrise in the northern skies. They are electric-blue coloured clouds which are 'shining' against the night skies. When you see them once you'll instantly recognise them the next time. They get their name from the Greek, meaning 'night shining'. They are fascinating to watch and make stunning photos. But what are they and how do they form?

They are caused by ice crystals (seeded on to dust particles) high in the atmosphere, 80 km up in the mesosphere. As the Sun sets or before it rises most of the rays are blocked by the Earth's shadow but, as these clouds are so high up and reflective, they bounce light over the horizon further, making the light more visible after sunset (or before sunrise). In late June they may be visible in the north all night.

They are a summer phenomenon, as in May, June, July and early August, the Mesosphere is, surprisingly, then at its coolest. Also, displays are becoming a bit more common (possibly due to pollution and/or more rocket launches creating more dust particles) but they are regularly seen.

The other thing which stops us getting bored during the longer days and short nights is solar observing. First can I make it clear that proper eye protection is needed - solar filters on telescopes and binoculars, blocking off finder 'scopes and eclipse glasses for naked eye viewing. Sunglasses are not sufficient! The Sun can cause serious and irreparable damage to your eyes, as well as your equipment!

With a solar 'scope, sunspots prominences and flares are visible. With correct filters and magnification, granulation of the surface can be seen.



Another way to view the sun is to project it through a single binocular or telescope onto a white sheet behind. This will show any dark sunspots on the solar disc and it is a great way to display to multiple people. Clearly using any projection like this needs to be done carefully, as mentioned before, you should never look into the 'scope and there can be a lot of heat projected, so you should keep the projection away from skin and even the paper and card it is projected on should also be monitored.

As the Sun is close to solar maximum, these features should be easily visible, and you can do at a sensible time of the day.

Club Nights offer more information on what to look out for each month. If it is clear we do some observing just outside the Village Hall, so please join us. There is no charge initially to come along and find out more, but if you do want to become a member then the fee is just £20 a year and it's free if you are in full-time education. 



Dear Friends,

My final service will be at Ettington church on **Sunday 28th June** at the 10am Cafe Church - all welcome!

Thank you to those who give so generously of their time, energy and skills to support the church and myself. This army of the blessed includes those who serve as officers of our parishes, those elected to represent us on our PCCs, our Churchwardens, those who carry out the unseen (and often unsung) ministry of administration, those who work making music, those who make our churches beautiful, keep the church clean, lock and up the doors and so much more.

The prophets usually looked around them and thought God must have meant someone else - surely not me? I'm not wise enough. I don't have the right words. I've no idea what to do. I grew up singing the Patrick Appleford hymn based on St Theresa's prayer;

Christ has no body now but yours,
 No hands, no feet on earth but yours.
 Yours are the eyes with which he looks along with the people here
 Compassion on this world,
 Yours are the feet with which he walks to do good,
 Yours are the hands, with which he blesses all the world.
 Yours are the hands, yours are the feet,
 Yours are the eyes, you are his body.
 Christ has no body now on earth but yours.

So please do give some serious thought and prayer about supporting the work of our churches. Another sign of a healthy church is that everyone does a little rather than a few doing a lot. I wish you all God's blessings.

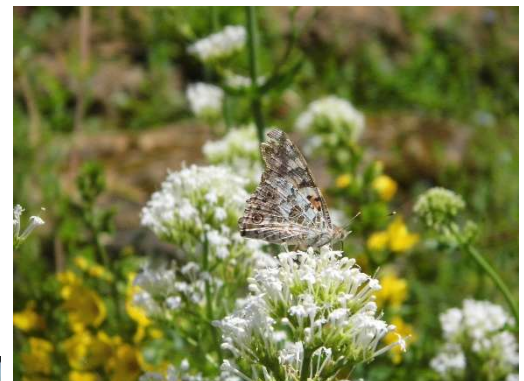
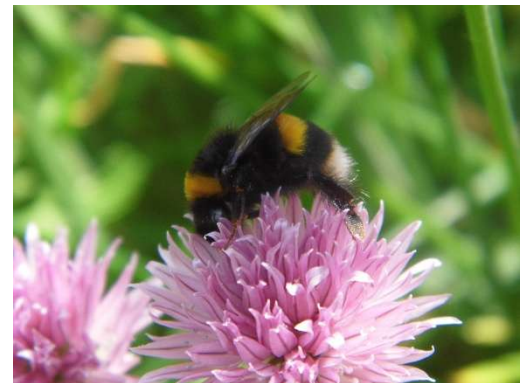
